After a summer of incredibly hot days and unbelievably high numbers of forest fires in much of the province, we yearn for calm serenity. There has been stress to those evacuated from their homes and anxiety for the entire province as we realize the devastation to flora and fauna. The despair for communities that have lost major employers, homes beyond repair, people now living with illnesses from air-born diseases, is more than most of us can comprehend. A number of congregations in Kamloops-Okanagan Presbytery have been directly impacted. Princeton, Ashcroft, Barriere, Clearwater, Clinton, the 3 Kamloops churches, and Lillooet Pastoral Charges have all been directly affected by the fires. We hold them tenderly in prayer, knowing that God grants comfort and compassion.

Penticton United Church has been blessed with an outstanding Sermons that Speak series in July. Five of the best preachers in British Columbia (an in Canada) challenged, encouraged and provoked us to be faithful followers of Jesus Christ. With such a rich banquet of worship delicacies, we feel nourished and energized for the fall. For every \$100 (one hundred dollars) you spend at Safeway, SaveOn, Superstore, or Wholesale Club for *groceries, prescriptions, flowers, magazines, gifts etc.* PUC will earn an average of \$4.70..now isn't that easy! Adds up quickly too.....last year Stewardship added over \$6,000 to the General Fund just by supporters using grocery cards. Cards are available after worship on Sundays and Tues. to Fri. in the Office.

Did You Know:

- 74% of our members give to the local fund
- \$1,147.50 is the average yearly donation given to local fund
- 50% of our members give to the M&S fund
- \$327 is the average yearly donation to M&S fund
- 7% of the total budget is designated for the M&S fund (donor's choice)
- 39% of budget is clergy compensation
- 32% of budget is all other staff compensation
- It costs \$37/day to cover the cost of gas and electricity
- It costs \$174 per day to open the building and keep it clean and user friendly
- 28 members donate using PAR (16% of our regular givers)
- PAR givers donate, on average, \$1662, while non PAR givers donate, on average, \$786
